

HEALTH PROTOCOL

1st of March, 2022

The school applies the recommendations of the local health authorities, in consultation with the diplomatic post, the consulate general, the MENJS and AEFÉ.

This health protocol is supported by the health and safety commission and presented to all staff and families.

Measures taken within the school:

- Cleaning and disinfection of the school;
- Cleaning of contact surfaces, sanitary facilities, regularly during the day;
- Provision of sanitary equipment: soap and disposable towels in all water points;
- Provision of hydroalcoholic solutions and disposable towels in all classrooms;
- Training of staff in preventive actions for the fight against Covid-19.

Measures to take before coming to school, for students and staff:

- Temperature taking and health assessment. No one will be admitted to the premises of the establishment if they show symptoms of poor health;
- Wearing a mask is compulsory for the home-school-home journey;
- Wearing a mask is compulsory for all, within the school
- Secondary students must bring a bottle of hydroalcoholic gel;
- All primary and secondary students bring their water bottle and their masks.

Measures taken upon arrival at school and in the school:

- A medical declaration via QR code or paper is to be completed for people outside the school;
- The taking of temperature at the entrance of the school is compulsory. Above 37°8, the person will be refused entry to the school;
- Wearing a mask is compulsory and must correspond to the size of the student.

General hygiene instructions to be observed by all:

- Respect social distancing measures;
- Wash your hands regularly and thoroughly with soap and water;
- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue or in the bend of your elbow when coughing or sneezing;
- Do not spit, be sure to throw paper tissues in the trash;
- Do not lend your water bottle and wash it every day with cleaning product;
- The water bottles are moved to the level of school life, UPMD room, infirmary, primary school management level in order to verify the proper application of safety guidelines;
- Upstream training and regular reminders to students of safety guidelines and general hygiene instructions;
- Everyone cleans their table when entering the classroom.

Procedures for caring for a sick student in the school:

- In the case of a pupil who presents several symptoms, the nursing service picks him up in class and warns the family so that they can pick him up; While waiting, the student is placed in an isolation room – UPMD room or another free room;
- The return to high school will take place after presentation of a negative antigenic test sent by email to the secretariat of the 1st degree or to School Life for the second degree.

F0 - actions to be taken:

- When a student learns that he is F0, he immediately notifies the primary secretariat or Vie Scolaire and sends the photo of the antigenic test dated and signed with name and surname. He or she reports people likely to be “F1”;
- The person self-isolates for 7 days;
- On the 7th day, if the antigen test is negative, return to school

- Always on the 7th day, if the test is positive and the person is vaccinated (2 doses), it is 3 additional days of isolation;
- If the test is positive and the person is not vaccinated, it is 7 more days.
- Vie Scolaire calls the families of students likely to be F1
- Return to school is subject to the presentation of a negative test provided by a laboratory.

F1 - actions to be taken:

Definition: The person becomes F1 or contact case, when they have been in close contact with an F0 case without a mask, for more than 15 minutes, at less than 2 meters and in a closed place, up to 48 hours before; Consequently, when a student is declared F0, the class and the teacher are not systematically declared F1;

- For F1, 5 day-isolation from the last contact: for example, if his last contact goes back to Saturday, the person is isolated until Wednesday, and is tested this same Wednesday evening. If the test is positive, the person is F0. If the test is negative, the student returns to school with his test as proof.
- Contact cases are determined after discussion with the F0;
- The primary secretariat, the nursing service and the Vie Scolaire communicate with the families concerned.
- The family will come to pick up their child.

For students declared F0 and F1, pedagogical continuity is ensured by PRONOTE and EDUCARTABLE.
